GREAT NORTHWEST FOREST CLEANUP PROPOSAL

WHAT? Volunteer cleanup of wilderness lands throughout Northwestern British Columbia. Over a designated time volunteers will be encouraged to pick up and remove all human litter, garbage and debris from gravel pits, roadsides, pull-offs, picnic sites, etc. on forest and wilderness lands. Volunteers will be provided with garbage bags and encouraged to take collected material to a proper disposal location.

WHO? Through marketing and public information individuals will be encouraged to pick up litter as they enjoy the out-of-doors. Participating businesses will assist in marketing and promoting the cleanup.

WHEN? August 23 until September 2, 2014 - This time period will provide a broad range of time flexibility for people to clean up and also is near the end of the summer recreation period when litter has accumulated.

WHERE? Throughout the area of forest and wilderness lands accessible from Smithers. This includes any and all locations accessible by any means of transportation.

WHY? In many locations, whether roadside, trailside, gravel pits or generally in the bush, various sorts of human debris are scattered about. Some gravel pits are exceptionally littered with abandoned stoves, fridges, car bodies, etc. which are shot full of bullet holes. We live in a very beautiful part of the world so let's show pride and take care of it!

HOW? Participating businesses will promote the cleanup and date to their clients. Businesses will provide plastic garbage bags to all who want to participate.

MARKETING AND ORGANIZATION?
